AOC Alsace

Grape Variety
100% Pinot Gris

Ageing
3 to 5 years

Tasting notes

Eye : pale yellow color, brilliant and clear.
Nose : rather discrete due to its youth, clearly marked by fruity flavours (yellow peach, apricot).
Mouth : well balanced, dry, with a very good length. Gastronomic wine, without heaviness on the palate, fruity and tangy freshness that persists.

Food & Wine

The Pinot Gris is a very versatile wine which you can enjoy all along a menu. You can have it as an aperitif or with a buffet, pair it with some hot starters based on "foie gras", sweet and sour dishes, Thai food, with some game food cooked with vegetables/mushrooms, roasted meats, mild hard cheeses and desserts.

Origin

Various hill-sides around the little village of Bergheim with a predominance of heavy soils compound by clay and limestone.

Vintage

2023 is moving towards the climatic conditions of 2022.

After a fairly dry winter, the soils received useful rainfall in March and April to kick-start the season. The associated temperatures were cool, so the vines started their cycle 9-10 days later than last year and the average for the last 30 years.

Once again, this was a season with low rainfall and high temperatures, but fewer heatwaves. The long-awaited thundery showers in July and August enabled the harvest to proceed smoothly. Riesling grapes have suffered greatly from the heat and yields were adversely affected; the wines are mineral, fruity and crisp. Nevertheless, all the other grape varieties produced good quantities, and give warm and generous wines with a beautiful quality of ripe fruit.
